What we do...



What do we do?

We attend all types of 999 calls in our community and provide vital pre-hospital care, assessment and treatment in advance of the arrival of the ambulance - which will always be sent to the incident at the same time. We are not sent in place of the paramedics.

Why are we here?

Due to the remote nature of the area and particularly communities surrounding Gnosall, an ambulance and/or paramedic can take some time to reach the scene of an emergency. As we are in the community already, we can reach the scene quickly. So when you dial 999 and ask for an ambulance, we are dispatched at the same time but may get there sooner.



What do we spend our funds on?

In the past year, thanks to the kind generosity of our local supporters, we have purchased a new defibrillator with ECG capability at a cost of £1,835, other life saving equipment and training to the value of £4000, and £2,500 running costs for the responder vehicle.
